The Diocese of Northern Malawi, with only 14 parishes, is the youngest and smallest diocese in Malawi’s growing church. In order to sustain its growth and impact on the region there is a need for well-trained clergy. USPG Mission Companion Bishop Christopher Boyle has been leading the diocese since 2001 and recognises the importance of future leadership coming from within the region. The church continues to grow and needs able pastors to nurture it.

As well as running clergy and leadership training in the diocese, Bishop Christopher

recognises that health and education services are vital to the future of the country.

Bishop Christopher said the Diocese of Northern Malawi is helping to empower people through adult literacy programmes, training in agriculture and youth leadership, support groups for people living with HIV, and community projects for building school classrooms.

He said: ‘All of these things are ways of helping people to honour and respect themselves and to feel they are achieving something good through their own efforts.’
