South Africa has one of the highest prevalence of people living with HIV and AIDS, at approximately 30 per cent of the population. The debilitating illness takes people in the prime of their life, which devastates families and communities. Such premature death also complicates efforts to fight poverty, improve health and promote development.

With the help of USPG, the Church in South Africa is taking practical action to combat HIV. In Port Elizabeth, the church-run House of Resurrection Haven is a home which cares for those living with

HIV. It is a place of love and security, where some regain their lost strength, empowered by a sense of self-worth, and others are able to end their days among compassionate friends. Children who have been orphaned, abandoned or have very sick parents are given a loving home where they can play, sing and learn. In addition, staff at House of Resurrection Haven reach out to the surrounding community, raising awareness and training school teachers, priests and community workers how to offer effective support and share a message of hope.
