About this Project...

With one in five adults HIV positive, life expectancy in Zambia today is now thought to average as low as 33 years. As well as dealing with the effects of HIV, the tuberculosis ward at St Francis' Hospital is regularly filled to capacity, and malaria is the major local cause of death for children aged under five years. Hospital administrator Ian and Dr Shelagh Parkinson are USPG Mission Companions working at St Francis' Hospital. With its network of 14 rural clinics, the hospital is working hard to combat these diseases with a wide range

of initiatives.

The hospital contains about 360 beds and cots. However this total is never a limit to the number of in-patients, as space on the floor can always be found and it is a common occurrence for patients to be found sleeping on the floors of the hospital wards.

It has been estimated that the hospital runs on a budget of £1.50 per patient per day – compared with £125 per patient per day in British hospitals.
