Myanmar (also known as Burma) has one of the world’s most under-resourced healthcare systems; tens of thousands dying each year from malaria, tuberculosis, AIDS, dysentery, diarrhoea and other illnesses. For impoverished village communities in the mountainous region of Yangon and Mandalay, healthcare is sometimes non-existent. Although healthcare is ostensibly free, the reality is that patients have to pay for medicines and treatment, even in public clinics and hospitals. Often, people live in poor conditions and

earn low wages, which means they cannot afford to pay for medicines or medical equipment. The aims of this Project are to support health workers as they care for hill tribes, migrant workers and their families, and the disadvantaged and vulnerable. Money donated through USPG will go towards free medicine and treatment for people who otherwise could not afford healthcare.

Project supporters will receive three newsletters a year and other resources to help promote your Project.
