USPG is the Anglican mission agency, founded in 1701, that partners churches and communities worldwide in God’s mission to enliven faith, strengthen relationships, unlock potential and champion justice.

STRATEGY

In 2018 USPG launched a new strategy with three key aims to - Rethink Mission, Energise Church and Community and Champion Justice. These are delivered through four teams – Global Relations, Mission Engagement, Finance and Resources and Communications. USPG is currently engaged in a process of reviewing and developing a more detailed strategy and set of objectives for 2021-2023.

JOB PURPOSE:

To provide leadership for USPG’S theological engagement with all partner churches, including those of Britain and Ireland and to develop its capacity to facilitate theological education.

The post sits within the Mission Engagement team, led by the Revd Canon Richard Bartlett, however the post-holder will also work very closely with members of our Global Relations team and also with the General Secretary.

What are we looking for?

This role of Global Theologian at USPG is unique, exciting and wide-ranging. It requires gifts of intellect, empathy and communication through speech and the written word. It requires a humble disposition and curious mind open to the particularities of the Christian life within Anglican and United churches within very different contexts. The post-holder will delight in rich and multilateral theological conversations in relation to issues such as the climate crisis, gender-based violence, inter-religious living and indigenous rights - just some of the issues that will come across their desk.

We are seeking to appoint a person with a deep commitment to contextual, liberative, dialogic and postcolonial/decolonial approaches to theology. They will have a broad missiological understanding, appreciate inductive methodologies and enjoy interdisciplinary engagement as well as working in ecumenical and interfaith contexts. They will be familiar with at least two regional contexts, but must be able to navigate the British context with confidence.

We are looking for a versatile and wide-ranging thinker capable of speaking into a range of different contexts and writing in different ways for different audiences. However, like many highly distinctive roles, the gifts and experience of the person appointed will shape the role in quite particular ways. Some of that will flow from the background and the experience of the post-holder and their distinctive skills will, to some degree, determine the relative balance of different activities within the role. It is hoped, indeed expected, that they will

have a distinctive theological voice and make their own contributions to a field within theology commensurate with the main focus of their work at USPG.

Further details

The post is open to lay or ordained theologians in any Anglican Church or church in full communion with the Church of England. If a member of clergy is appointed who needs accommodation, this option will be explored further in conversation.

USPG is a Tier 2 licensed sponsor.

It is a genuine occupational requirement (GOR) of this post that the individual be an active member of an Anglican church or a church in communion with the Anglican Church.

The successful candidate will be required to provide an up to date DBS check (if UK nationals) or the equivalent police checks to allow them to work with vulnerable adults and children. All shortlisted applicants will be required to submit identity documents and relevant qualifications.
